### File of Complaint and Request for Disclosure of Information

With respect to the final recommendation given at the 995<sup>th</sup> Radio Regulatory Council (RRC) Meeting regarding the “Authorization of Establishment Plans for Specified Base Stations for Upgrading of Broadband Wireless Access (BWA) Systems,” Wireless City Planning Inc. (WCP) objects to the final recommendation as the RRC did not appropriately evaluate WCP’s application in an objective and fair manner from a technical perspective. WCP also questions the validity of the recommendation process in light of media reports stating that the authorized carrier was effectively chosen before the actual RRC deliberations took place. Based on these concerns about the RRC’s effectiveness, WCP hereby issues an official File of Complaint as follows.

In conjunction, to establish that the evaluation process for WCP’s application was subjective and biased, WCP is hereby submitting a Request for Disclosure of Information as follows.

If this File of Complaint is not accepted, WCP will consider measures in line with the Administrative Appeal Act and Administrative Case Litigation Act.

#### 1) File of Complaint (Requests)

- Extension to the Authorization of Establishment Plans for Specified Based Stations for Upgrading Broadband Wireless Access (BWA) Systems process
- Reconvening of RRC Meeting

Hearings and deliberations should be conducted in a manner open to the public, allowing people to hear from the applicants directly rather than through indirect deliberations based on the review of subjective evaluation materials by a limited

number of supervisory officials at the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications (MIC).

2) Request for Disclosure of Information

- WCP requests the disclosure of all information on persons related directly and indirectly to MIC's authorization on this matter, including information on former MIC officials related to the application process (including "revolving door" former officials who now have positions at applicant companies), and their mobile phone call logs, meeting memorandum and materials, PC and mobile phone email records and all other materials related to the application and deliberation process of related personnel.
